Dear Parent/Guardian,

Telfair County High School, students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families, agree that this compact outlines how the parents, the entire school staff, and the students will share the responsibility for improved student academic achievement as well as describes how the school and parents will build and develop a partnership that will help children achieve the State's high standards.

JOINTLY DEVELOPED

During the school year, all parents have multiple opportunities to provide input and jointly develop the compact for the upcoming school year. These opportunities include the District Parent Advisory Council Meeting and the Parent Compact Survey distributed to all parents in the spring. The compact is also revised during School Parent Advisory Council Meetings and Leadership Meetings in the spring. Student and teacher surveys are also conducted to gather revision input.

To understand how working together can benefit your child, it is first important to understand the district's and school's goals for student academic achievement.

Telfair County School District GOALS:

The Telfair County School District will increase the percentage of students scoring at developing learner or above on the Georgia Milestones Assessment System (End of Grade Test and End of Course Test) in Mathematics, Science, Social Studies and English/Language Arts by 3% each year.

Telfair County High School GOALS:

By the end of the school year, Telfair County High School will show a 3% increase from the 2018 baseline data in content mastery in the areas of ELA, Math, Science, and Social Studies as measured by the Georgia Milestones Assessment.

On the last benchmark for each class, 95% of students will score 70% or higher utilizing USATestprep.

Emphasis will be placed on identified areas of weaknesses which include problem solving skills, mathematical reasoning, transfer of mathematical knowledge, reading comprehension and close reading.

To help your child meet the district and school goals, the school, you, and your child will work together to:

SCHOOL/TEACHER RESPONSIBILITIES:

Telfair County High School will:

- 1. Provide a high quality curriculum and instruction in a supportive and effective learning environment that enables children to meet the high student academic achievement standards by: Teachers will introduce new skills/concepts using authentic application problems so that students see relevance for learning. They will also use assignments that foster creative problem solving. Teacher will also use a variety of ways to teach the subject matter, including how information is given to/received by the student as well as how the student shows comprehension and mastery of the material.
- 2. Provide strategies/activities to students in the classroom that are focused on parents partnering with the teacher to support the student in achieving their academic goals.
 - USATestprep lessons will be assigned so parents can work with their child at home.
 - IXL math lessons will be assigned to target student weaknesses in math. The IXL lessons will include a tutorial explaining how to work the problems so that parents can help students complete the lessons.
 - Teachers will assign Science, ELA, Social Studies and Math bell ringer activities that will be kept in each student's notebook for parents to review with their child.
 - PowerSchool login information will be sent home by the student at the beginning of the school year so that parents can monitor their child's progress.
 - Teachers will send information home about the Big Idea Rubric and help students chart their progress and encourage them to discuss it with their parents.
- 3. Hold Parent/Teacher conferences during which this compact will be discussed as it relates to each individual student's achievement. Staff will be available for consultation with parents after students are dismissed or at a time mutually agreed upon by parent and staff member during the school year. The School-Parent Compact will be discussed at conferences to hold everyone accountable and ensure the student is successful at school.
- 4. **Provide parents with frequent reports on their child's progress.** The school will provide progress reports as follows: progress reports will be sent home every 4 ½ weeks and report cards every 9 weeks. Parents may also see grades by utilizing the Parent Portal on the school's website.
- 5. **Provide parents reasonable access to staff.** Staff will be available for consultation with parents after students are dismissed or at a time mutually agreed upon by parent and staff member. Parents are welcomed to meet at school in a mutually agreed upon location. Parents may contact staff members by telephone, letter or email for an appointment.
- 6. Provide parents opportunities to volunteer and participate in their child's class, and observe classroom activities as follows: Teachers will send home information with every student on ways and

dates for parents to volunteer in their classes. Lessons will be implemented that will allow parents to sign-up as teacher aides to assist and/or observe specific instructional lessons tailored to that content area. These lessons will give parents hand-on activities to participate during the instructional period as well as guidance for supporting the student at home. Also, parents may be given opportunities to volunteer as chaperones or teacher aides on off-campus learning activities.

PARENT RESPONSIBILITIES:

We, as parents, will:

- monitor and discuss with our child the Big Ideas Rubric for each academic class.
- volunteer in activities when opportunities arise throughout the school year.
- utilize USATestprep and IXL math lessons to give my child extra support with mathematics and reading comprehension to encourage academic success.
- discuss each day's assignments with our child, ask questions, and assist them with homework.
- utilize the IXL math website to improve mathematics skills.
- encourage our student to read often at home and have discussions with us over what they read.
- check our child's grades and attendance on PowerSchool.
- read and discuss our child's bell ringer activities weekly.

STUDENT RESPONSIBILITIES:

We, as students, will:

- keep a Big Ideas Rubric current for each academic class and discuss my progress with my parents.
- keep bell ringer assignments in a notebook/journal as assigned by the teacher.
- utilize the USATestprep lessons assigned by the teacher to practice and show these resources to my parent or older family member.
- utilize the IXL math website to improve mathematics skills.
- read 15 to 30 minutes per day outside of the classroom and tell my parent what I'm reading and the progress I'm making.
