Who is it for?

TCES operates a school-wide Title I program. All students and their families are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. TCES will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents with limited English, parents with disabilities, and parents of migratory children.

In grades 3-5, the percentage of all students scoring level 3 or level 4 on the GMAS in ELA, Mathematics, and Science (grade 5) will increase by 5%.
